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KEY VOTE "YES" ON TRADE PROMOTION AUTHORITY

Dear Senator:

On behalf of the members of the American Apparel & Footwear Association, and the four million trade-dependent U.S. workers the industry employs, I am writing to express strong support for the Bipartisan Congressional Trade Priorities and Accountability Act of 2015.

AAFA has key voted cloture on the motion to proceed on this important trade promotion authority (TPA) legislation as a **YES** vote.

Once enacted, TPA will facilitate completion of negotiations for the Trans-Pacific Partnership (TPP) with 11 Pacific Rim countries and the Trans-Atlantic Trade and Investment Partnership (T-TIP) with the European Union.
