Dear Chairmen Thune, Inhofe, and Shuster and Ranking Members Nelson, Boxer and DeFazio:

On behalf of the undersigned organizations representing manufacturers, farmers and agribusinesses, wholesalers, retailers, importers, exporters, distributors, transportation and logistics providers, and other supply chain stakeholders, we urge support for the "*Port Performance Act*" as included in the Senate passed version of the "*DRIVE Act*" (H.R. 22). This provision will help to gain empirical visibility into the operating efficiency of US ports, and help to identify key congestion issues that affect the flow of our nation's commerce. <u>As a conferee, we urge you to support the provision in conference</u>.

Thousands of US businesses employing millions of American workers depend on global supply chains for the efficient movement of food, manufactured products, and components to production. Unfortunately, congestion at US ports has become commonplace, creating slowdowns, bottlenecks, and chokepoints that impact the efficient flow of cargo with farreaching impacts on the US economy. For instance, a July, 2015 report from the Federal Reserve estimated slowdowns at West Coast ports were an important contributor to the .2% decline in US GDP during the first quarter of 2015.

And yet, despite the clear, demonstrated importance of US ports to American economic activity, there are, today, no consistent or objective efforts to measure port performance within the Department of Transportation, even though the Department regularly measures congestion affecting other nodes on the US transportation system. The Port Performance Act provisions included in HR 22 would remedy this situation, by calling for the development of a set of agreed-upon metrics, and the annual reporting of port statistics.

Collecting basic, uniform port performance data is an essential step in ensuring that we are ready to meet and solve future challenges facing our ports. While we recognize that every port is different, the exercise of defining a set of common performance metrics will go a long way toward helping policymakers, port administrators, and American exporters and importers understand the dynamics that create congestion, thereby enabling them to work together to find solutions that will benefit the US economy. Developing agreed-upon performance measures would not jeopardize safety; indeed, studying congestion is likely to provide solutions that will create safer working environments.

We stand ready to work with you in support of this provision within the DRIVE Act.
